LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends.

As we reflect on the past year, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for the remarkable achievements and profound impact Meals on Wheels Rowan has made in our community.

After a decade of service on the Meals on Wheels Rowan Board of Directors, I had the distinct honor of stepping into the role of Board President in 2023. Over the years, I have witnessed the extraordinary growth of our organization and our unwavering commitment to delivering More than a Meal to homebound seniors across Rowan County.

In 2023, we faced a significant increase in demand for our services, with referrals to our home-delivered meals program rising by 23%. May marked an all-time high with 97 referrals in a single month. Our dedicated Care Coordinators worked tirelessly to support participants and their families, signing them up not only for meals but also providing vital referrals to other resources that help seniors remain safely and comfortably in their homes.

To meet this growing demand, we expanded our capacity to offer fully subsidized Home-Delivered Meals. By increasing our capacity from 100 to 110 fully subsidized clients, we ensured that even more of Rowan County's most vulnerable seniors could receive the nourishment and care they deserve, regardless of their ability to pay. This effort required extraordinary commitment from our staff, who conducted thorough in-home assessments to prioritize those most in need.

Our Development and Marketing team rose to the challenge of securing funding to sustain and grow these services. Through relentless dedication, they applied for 32 grants, securing significant funding to subsidize meals for seniors in need. Additionally, our creative and engaging fundraising efforts made 2023 a standout year. Highlights included the Valentine's Non-Event, which raised over \$180,000, and the continued success of August is for AniMEALs. We also launched an exciting new event, Pawsitively PURRFect Night Out at Barnhardt Jewelers, which was a resounding hit.

As my first term as President concludes, I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to our volunteers, donors, and staff. Your unwavering dedication to delivering More than a Meal has left an indelible mark on the lives of countless homebound seniors.

Thank you for entrusting me with the privilege of serving Meals on Wheels Rowan. Together, we can continue to make a meaningful and lasting impact on the lives of those we serve.

OUR PROGRAMS

We utilize an integrated approach to seniors' health, focusing on nutrition, safety, socialization, and community connections. We provide services to qualified individuals regardless of their ability to pay for their meals or groceries so that they can remain in their homes, maintain their independence, and age in place.

506 unduplicated home-delivered meals participants served

Home-Delivered Meals Program

Our Home-Delivered Meals Program continues to provide nutritious and tasty meals to homebound seniors who are unable to prepare their own meals. On average, we served 305 seniors each day and delivered 68,292 total meals in 2023.





participants received fully subsidized home-delivered meals

In 2023, our Board of Directors increased our budgeted capacity to provide fully subsidized meals from 100 individuals at one time to 110. Throughout the year, we provided 21,354 free meals to low-income and food-insecure participants.

894 groceries delivered

Grocery Program

We continue to provide the Grocery Program to homebound seniors who can still prepare nutritious meals but have financial constraints and difficulty with mobility outside of their homes. Grocery Program volunteers shopped and delivered groceries to 54 individuals. Participants received groceries twice a month; each order provided approximately 42 meals. In 2023, we provided approximately 37,500 meals through the Grocery Program.

Partnership with Rowan Helping Ministries

During the pandemic, we partnered with Rowan Helping Ministries to deliver USDA Food Boxes to their clients who could not pick them up. We utilized our courier to deliver 387 USDA Food Boxes across Rowan County to Rowan Helping Ministries clients.



6,660 Medically Tailored Meals delivered

Medically Tailored Meals Program

As of June 2023, all participants choose from a traditional, low-sodium, or diabetic meal. The addition of the Medically Tailored Meals Program enables us to serve more seniors with specific dietary requirements. In 2023, we served 68 participants on the Medically Tailored Meals Program





726 pet food deliveries to clients

AniMEALS Program

The AniMEALs Program provides pet food, basic veterinary care, and wellness checks to the pets of our senior meal recipients. In 2023, we delivered pet food 726 times to 110 clients and helped arrange 29 veterinary care visits. Pets are an important part of our seniors's physical and emotional well-being, and the AniMEALS program ensures that our clients can keep their pets healthy and nourished at home.
